Newly ordained Fr. Casey Coleman, vicar at St. Vincent de Paul led our Vigil. Bless our dear priests and all the Helpers who attended.

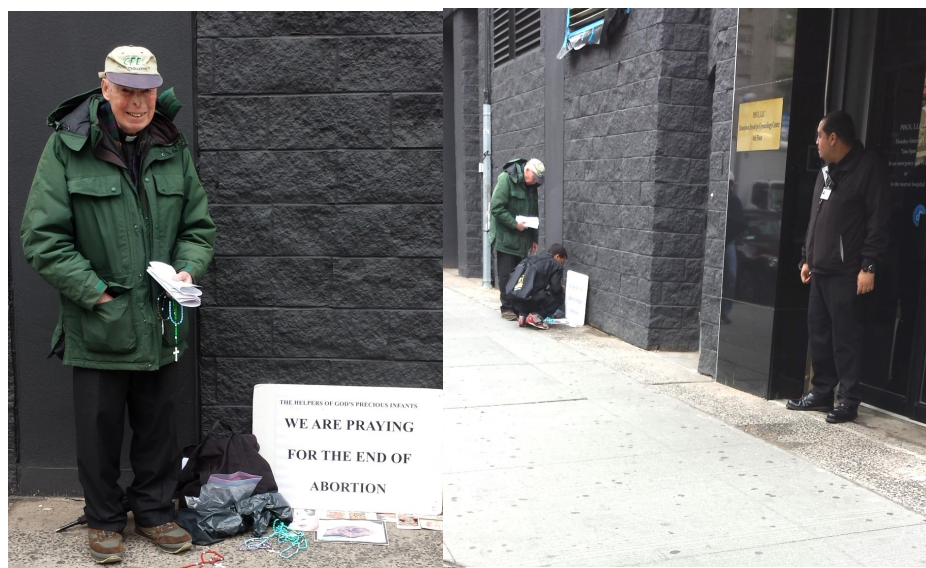

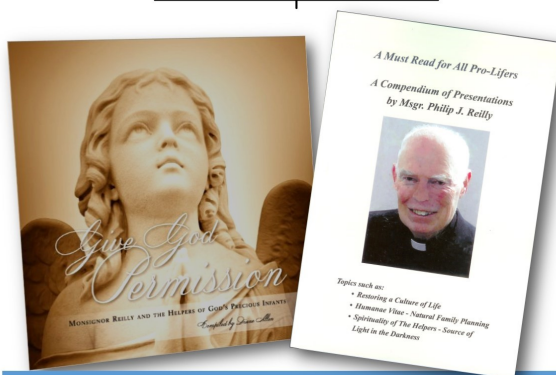

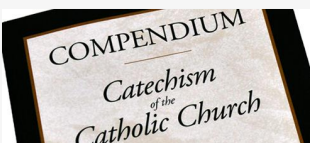
### Why Change Now?

- To better catechize and feed the faithful at Mass
- To attract non-practicing Catholics back to Mass
- For Catholics to be able to defend against the Culture of Death
- To better evangelize the world
- To light a fire and create a thirst among Catholics that will inflame a holy passion
- A tool for priests to allow homily preparation easy & more effective



### Church Teaching!

- The Ordinary Sunday catechetical lectionary contains Scripture readings based directly on Pope Benedict XVI's *Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church* and the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.
- This new lectionary is to be used by the Universal Church on the 26 Ordinary Sundays (Ordinary Sundays not including major feast days).
- The Ordinary Sunday catechetical lectionary is the basis for a catechetical homily. This catechetical homily is simply a homily based on the Compendium, the Catechism, and Scripture.



### How Do We Implement These Changes?

- Gain approval from the Magisterium to produce an Ordinary Sunday catechetical lectionary.
- The Scripture references are based on the *Compendium* and the *Catechism*, which are broken down into 78 (26 x 3) sections based on 26 Ordinary Sundays on a three-year cycle.
- Every priest prepares for his catechetical homily using the catechetical lectionary
- Result: Catholics are taught their faith directly from the *Compendium* and the *Catechism*.

Considering that around 23% of Catholics actually attend Sunday Mass these days we need a strong, informed, and unified voice to lead the flock. We need a truly universal voice. This simple change is needed as leaven to boost the flock. Adding teachings from the Catechism can only help! In addition, today's homiletic structure is Scripturally based (not bad in itself) but priests are forced to sort through the *Catechism* to match up the Scriptures with the Church's teachings. What ends up happening is that one priest will preach on one topic, another priest will preach on another topic and there is no guarantee that those topics are from the *Catechism*. More often than not, Catholics are not being taught the Church's teachings systematically and this one simple factor contributes heavily to the mess the world is in. A catechetical homily will solve this problem. Let's face it, Christ gave us the Sacraments and our Church has given us the *Catechism* through Christ's wisdom. Let's put them together and set the world on fire!
